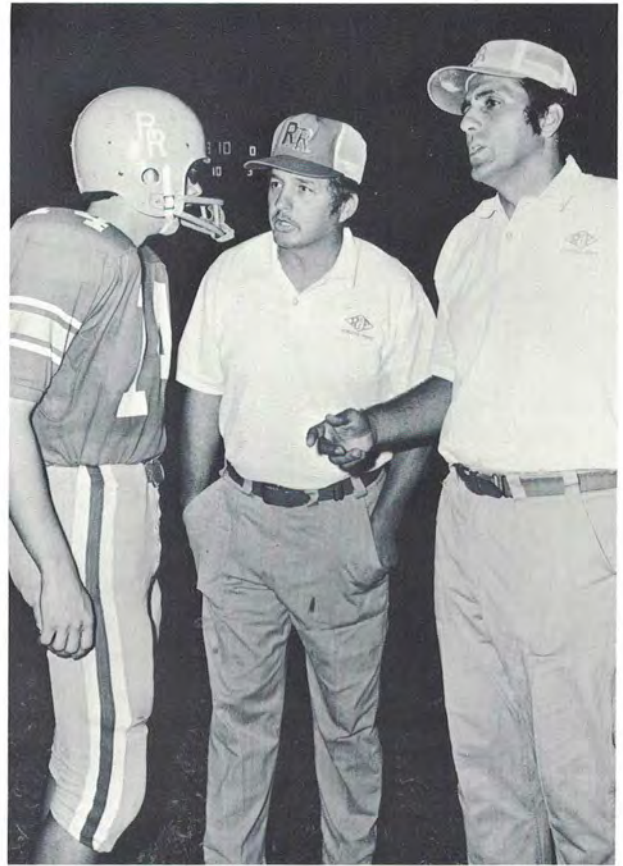

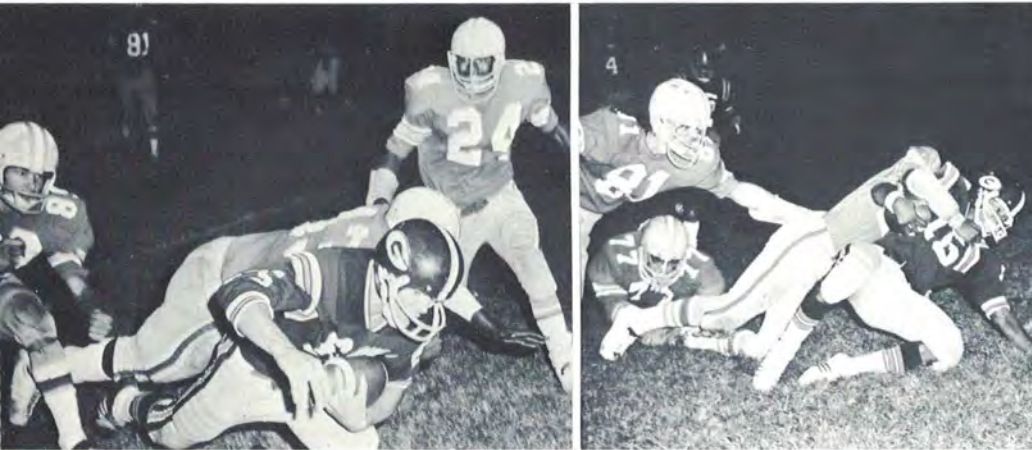

Bennie Smith, a newcomer to the kicking game, forced many opponents deep into their own territory with his booming kick-offs.

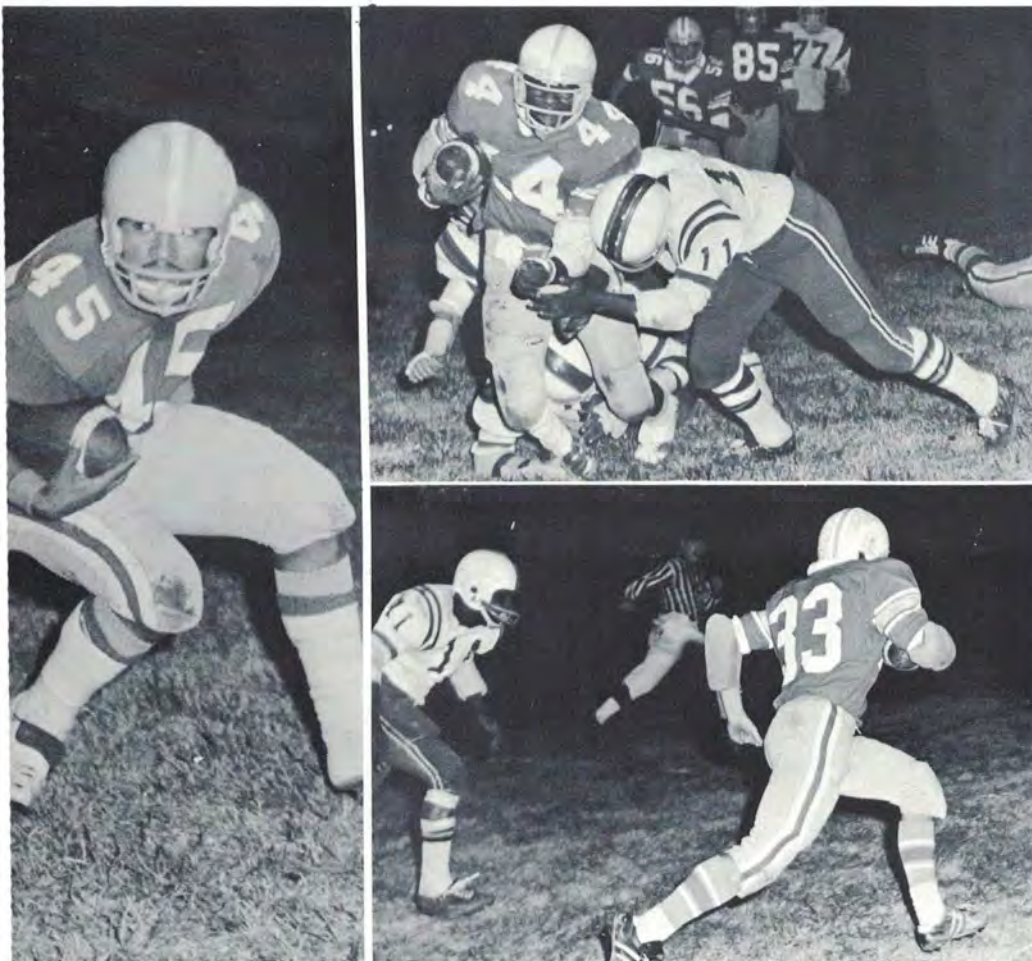
## Cougars Demolish Goldsboro in Playoffs, 38-6

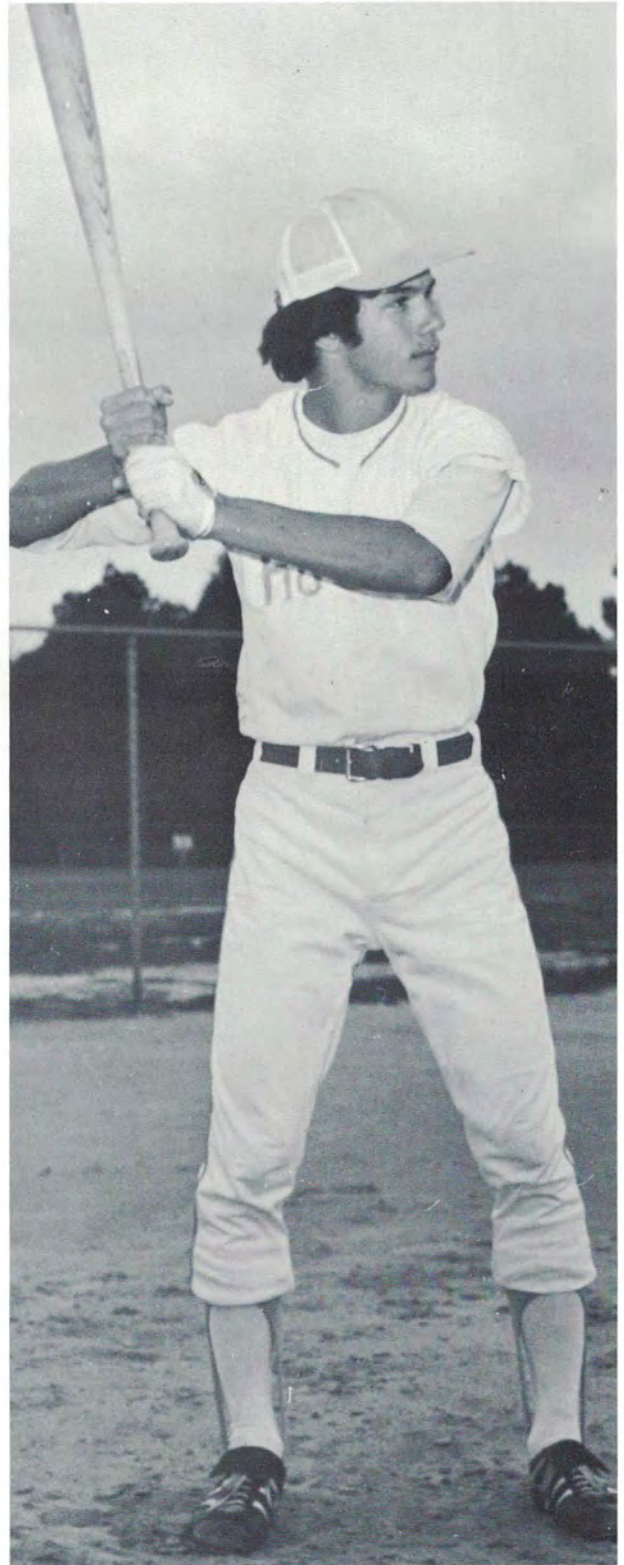
